PLEASE TAKE TIME TO REVIEW OUR CHURCH IN PERSON SPIRITUAL WORSHIP SERVICE'S PLANS AND INSTRUCTION FOR OUR OWN SAFETY MEASURES:

- Any person known to have had any contact with COVID-19 confirmed cases should not be allowed to attend the worship services. PLEASE STAY HOME UNTIL YOU ARE CONFIRMED COVID FREE or obtain written note from your doctor.
- Prior to and following any in-person service, the facility/church will be sanitized at its best.
- Attendance will be limited to regular adult attendees with no known COVID case.
- Please try to take your temperature at home, including all family members that plans to attend church.
- Any person who will have a fever will be sent home and stay home until fever is gone.
- High-risk individuals are advised to stay home and not attend the in-person services.
- Attendees may be advised not to engage in hand shaking, Aloha hugs and kissing and any other physical contact, however we can love on each other with the biggest smiles.
- Hand sanitizer is available in various place within the church or bring your own...
- Chairs in designated sitting areas such as the lounge area and the café, should be marked to keep non cohabitating congregants at least 6ft apart.
- People who live together may sit closer together but otherwise social distancing should be in place.
- Doors will be opened by ushers to prevent the need for congregants to touch doors while entering and exiting the church and sanctuary.
- Attendees must constantly wash their hands with soup for at least 20 seconds at a time.
- Elderly, pre existing condition and children are likely the victim of COVID19, we apologetically request that you stay home until the situation is confirmed safe.
- Wear Mask: AT ALL TIMES!
- DEFINITELY DO NOT CONGREGATE IN VISIBLE AREAS.
